

What does this mean for my curling club?

CURLING:

Businesses that implement the Restrictions Exemption Program can operate as usual if they only serve people (*ages 12 and over) who have:

- **proof of vaccination.** Note: SACC's mandated requirements supersede any line items from the provincial guidelines that have been struck out below.

Note: in SACC's "Covid 19 Vaccination Policy and Self-Declaration" we mandated your double dose be required by Oct 31st and are now abiding by the dates below.

- single dose accepted between September 20 and-October 25 if received 2 weeks before time of service
- double doses required after October 25
- **documentation of a medical exemption.**
- ~~proof of a privately – paid negative PCR or rapid test within 72 hours of service (tests from AHS or Alberta Precision Laboratories not allowed)~~
- **IMPORTANT: ALL MEMBERS AND GUEST ARE REQUIRED TO CARRY THEIR PROOF OF VACCINATION OR MEDICAL EXEMPTION AT ALL TIMES.** We reserve the right to check member's vaccination proof periodically, but we do not have the staff to check every member every night.

*Note: Any youth under 12 that are ineligible for vaccination will be allowed to enter the building without proof of vaccination.

Businesses do not need to apply for the program. Audits and enforcement will occur to ensure rules are followed.

First League Draw:

Please come early for your first league draw to provide ample time for staff/volunteers to view your proof of vaccination at the door. The club will maintain a master list with the Vaccination status for all leagues/members including Associate Members (spares). For all proceeding league games, any members that have not been checked in, are required to do so - PRIOR TO

THEIR FIRST GAME with any of the following SACC staff – Office Staff or Ice Makers *for main floor* and Lounge Staff (Bartender) *on the 2nd level*.

REMEMBER: We are all in this together – our existence as a facility depends on it.

Practice Ice Users: All practice ice users must check in with any SACC Staff prior to accessing the ice

- **Masking and physical distancing** are mandatory in all indoor public spaces and workplaces. Note: Over the past 18 months, and because all Albertans have experienced the 2m(6ft) safe distancing guidelines, SACC will not be putting in any additional distancing markers, other than those in the ice. It will be up to the individual to always keep 2m of distance between themselves and others. This is particularly important when using the locker room and ordering at the bar or kitchen.
- Employees must mask in all indoor work settings, except while alone in workstations (this includes bar staff).

Protocols from last season that will NOT be enforced:

- no staging for teams going out to the ice other than individual distancing
- **Arena: Masks are optional when participating in physical activity.**
- All games will start at the home end.
- **2 sweepers are permitted.**
- Guests are welcome and encouraged for viewing *only if they can show proof of full vaccination* (see LOUNGE for more details).

For your protection, disinfectant wipes will be supplied, and it is encouraged that you clean your rocks, as well as your hands (sanitizer provided) before/after using the water dispensers, scoreboards, measuring devices and any high touch points. Note: SACC staff will continue to sanitize all touch points periodically throughout the day.

LOUNGE and LOUNGE RENTALS (protocols beyond those laid out under CURLING):

- The Mandatory Restriction Exemption Program starts September 20th, so we are still under the Sept 27th restrictions where Last Call is 10pm (no more than 2 drinks in anyone's possession after 10pm) with consumption by 11pm. Note: this only effects Fri & Sat Mixed this week.
- Guests are welcome and encouraged for viewing only if they can show proof of full vaccination. SACC's main doors are locked at 9pm each night and as such, anyone wanting to enter the building will need to use the doorbell for the bar staff to provide appropriate access. All guests are required to report to the bar with proof of their vaccination. Outside of lounge hours, all guests are required to show their proof of vaccination at the office.
- When partaking in the lounge, maintaining safe distancing is recommended, however, it is up to individuals/teams if they wish to socialize with their opposition.
- Indoor wedding and funeral receptions for up to 50 people, are acceptable where the hosting facility implements the restrictions exemption program.
- Lastly, if you are feeling ill.... stay in your HOUSE, not ours!
